THE GENERAL EXAMINATION

Bishop: My sisters and brothers in Christ, please stand today as I examine you. Those who will be ordained, commissioned, recognized, or licensed ministers, you are to be coworkers with all the people of God: with laity, bishops, elders, deacons, local pastors, provisional members, diaconal ministers, deaconesses, home missionaries, lay supply ministers, and certified lay ministers—with all who serve God in the Church.

Remember you are called to serve rather than to be served, to proclaim the faith of the church and no other, to look after the concerns of God above all.

So, we may know you believe yourselves to be called by God and that you profess the Christian faith, we ask you:

Do you believe that God has called you to the life and work of ordained, commissioned or licensed ministry?

I do so believe.

Do you believe in the Triune God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and confess Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior?

I do so believe and confess.

Are you persuaded that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments contain all things necessary for salvation through faith in Jesus Christ and are the unique and authoritative standard for the church's faith and life?

I am so persuaded, by God's grace.

Will you be faithful in prayer, in the study of the Holy Scriptures, and with the help of the Holy Spirit continually rekindle the gift of God that is in you?

I will, with the help of God.

Will you do your best to pattern your life in accordance with the teachings of Christ?

I will, with the help of God.

Will you, in the exercise of your ministry, lead the people of God to faith in Jesus Christ, to participate in the life and work of the community, and to seek peace, justice, and freedom for all people?

I will, with the help of God.

Will you be loyal to The United Methodist Church, accepting and upholding its order, liturgy, doctrine, and discipline, defending it against all doctrines contrary to God's Holy Word, and committing yourself to be accountable with those serving with you, and to the bishop and those who are appointed to supervise your ministry?

I will, with the help of God.

Will you, for the sake of the church's life and mission, covenant to participate in the life of the order, fellowship, or membership into which you are ordained, commissioned, received or recognized?

Will you give yourself to God through this connection in order to sustain and build each other up in prayer, study, worship, and service under the rule of life set forth in the vows you take this day?

I will, with the help of God.

May God, who has given you the will to do these things, give you grace to perform them, that the work begun in you may be brought to perfection.
Amen.

EXAMINATION OF PROVISIONAL MEMBERS

Bishop: These provisional members (elders and deacons) now begin their residency towards ordination. They are urged on by the love of Christ and strengthened by the Holy Spirit. They come to declare in public their desire to live out the covenant made at their baptism by binding themselves to the service of God under the supervision of the bishop and the guidance of colleagues in full connection and by being appointed to share as servant leaders in the body of Christ.

Today we commission them to service as they continue to prepare for ordained ministry among us.

Do you believe that God has called you to the life and work of a commissioned minister?

I do so believe.

Will you give yourself fully to the work of leadership and service among the people of God?

I will, with the help of God.

Bishop: I now invite you to kneel, taking the posture of Christ's servant in ministry.

The candidates kneel, the congregation prays for them in silence.

Bishop: God of the apostles and prophets, of the martyrs and teachers, you raise up men and women to be apostolic leaders in your church. By your Holy Spirit help these, your servants, to understand and live the mystery of your love with boldness and joy.

Deepen their sense of purpose as they exercise commissioned ministry. Empower them, and those who will walk with them to guide their ministry, together with all of your people, to heal the sick, love the outcast, resist evil, preach the Word, and give themselves freely for your name's sake. **Amen.**

I take great joy in my ministry of stole-making! The fabrics I pick for the ordinands' stoles reflect a diversity of reds, and the prints evoke the movement of the Holy Spirit and the growth of discipleship. I pray for the recipients of the stoles as I make each one. My hope is that my artwork will enhance their ministries.

Instruments and Sign Acts for the Service of Call & Ordering of Ministry

Ordinations ritualize the distinctiveness of the different orders. Thus, not only what is said, but what is done and the signs and instruments by which ordination is enacted is significant. Clear signs and instruments related to the ministry of deacons and the ministry of elders point to and convey the identity and work of each order.

For deacons, a stole is worn over the left shoulder and fastened under the right arm. The instrument to signify this order is the towel, pitcher, and basin.

For elders, a stole is worn, yoked at the back of the neck, hanging straight down from the shoulders. The instrument to signify this order is the paten and chalice.

Ministry of the Laity

What is a Deaconess?

Deaconesses and Home Missioners are laypeople who are called by God to be in a lifetime relationship in The United Methodist Church for engagement with a full-time vocation in ministries of love, justice, and service.

Deaconesses and Home Missioners function through diverse forms of service directed toward the world to make Jesus Christ known in the fullness of his ministry and mission, which mandate that his followers:

- Alleviate suffering
- Eradicate causes of injustice and all that robs life of dignity and worth
- Facilitate the development of full human potential
- Share in the building global community through the church universal

In 2016, General Conference recognized deaconesses and home missioners as an order. Members are consecrated, but unlike deacons, they are not ordained. The order is part of United Women in Faith.

Certified Lay Ministers

The certified lay minister is “called and equipped to conduct public worship, care for the congregation, assist in program leadership, develop

new and existing faith communities, preach the word, lead small groups, or establish community outreach ministries as part of a ministry team with the supervision and support of a clergy person.” (2016 BOD ¶268.1)

Lay Supply

¶205.4 (2016 *Book of Discipline*) states “When a pastoral charge is not able to be served by an ordained or licensed minister, the bishop, upon recommendation of the cabinet, may assign a qualified and trained layperson, lay minister or lay missionary to do the work of ministry in that charge. The lay person is accountable to the district superintendent or another ordained or licensed minister appointed to oversee the charge, who will make provision for sacramental ministry and provide guidance and mentoring to the layperson assigned. The layperson assigned is also accountable to the policies and procedures of the annual conference where assigned.”

**These are the Historic Questions asked of
these candidates at the Clergy Executive Session:**

(from The Book of Discipline, ¶336)

Historic Examination for Admission into Full Connection

1. Have you faith in Christ?
2. Are you going on to perfection?
3. Do you expect to be made perfect in love in this life?
4. Are you earnestly striving after it?
5. Are you resolved to devote yourself wholly to God and his work?
6. Do you know the General Rules of our Church?
7. Will you keep them?
8. Have you studied the doctrines of The United Methodist Church?
9. After full examination, do you believe that our doctrines are in harmony with the Holy Scriptures?
10. Will you preach and maintain them?
11. Have you studied our form of Church discipline and polity?
12. Do you approve our Church government and polity?
13. Will you support and maintain them?
14. Will you diligently instruct the children in every place?
15. Will you visit from house to house?
16. Will you recommend fasting or abstinence, both by precept and example?
17. Are you determined to employ all your time in the work of God?
18. Are you in debt so as to embarrass you in your work?
19. Will you observe the following directions?
 - a) Be diligent. Never be unemployed. Never be triflingly employed. Never trifle away time; neither spend any more time at any one place than is strictly necessary.
 - b) Be punctual. Do everything exactly at the time. And do not mend our rules, but keep them; not for wrath, but for conscience' sake.*

** These questions were formulated by John Wesley and have been little changed throughout the years.*
