## A Message from Our Co-Chairs

Dear United Methodists around the world,

In December 2024, when three United Methodists were killed in Munga Dosa, Nigeria, Bishop Ande Emmanuel and Rev. Eli Sule Yakku, together with other local leaders, stepped forward to comfort grieving families and steady their community. Their calm, courageous leadership kept the church united in a moment of deep pain.

Both leaders were formed at the United Methodist Banyam Theological Seminary in Bambur, Nigeria, where rigorous theological study is paired with practical leadership training. Their preparation made a profound difference when their community needed them most.

### **Our Shared Vision**

Through this initiative, we have the opportunity to extend the vision of the United Methodist Church: *To form disciples of Jesus Christ who, empowered by the Holy Spirit, love boldly, serve joyfully, and lead courageously in the community and the world.*

### **The Opportunity Before Us**

From August 30 – October 11, Virginia Methodists will join in a six-week journey of prayer, learning, and generosity—inviting our whole connection to love boldly, serve joyfully, and lead courageously.<sup>1</sup>

On **Miracle Sunday, October 11**, we are honored to serve as co-chairs of a worldwide offering that will help raise up a new generation of outstanding clergy leaders outside the United States. This work is urgent: fewer than 5% of pastors outside the U.S. hold a master's degree in theology, compared to more than 71% within the U.S.

### **The Miracle We Seek**

Our shared goal is bold: to endow 500 scholarships in perpetuity, ensuring that courageous, well-prepared leaders can serve in some of the most challenging missional communities around the world. Achieving this on a single Sunday will require prayer, faith, and a miracle. Yet we trust the Holy Spirit to multiply our gifts beyond what we can imagine.

### **A New Generation of Leaders**

In Ukraine, United Methodist pastors continue to offer worship, sacraments, and pastoral care amid war. Around the world, our seminaries prepare leaders who stand firm in hardship and hope. This appeal will equip up to more than 500 such leaders every year, women and men ready to serve where the need is greatest.

### **Join Us in the Miracle**

We invite you and your congregation to join us:

- Pray for God's miracle to be fulfilled in and through our church.
- Use Miracle Sunday resources to guide worship, learning, and giving.

### Context Matters

Across our worldwide connection, contexts vary. Congregations are encouraged to adapt materials—especially language and cultural examples—to resonate locally. Yet the core principles of this initiative transcend every setting. As we join 30,000 congregations around the globe, we invite every church to embrace these three guiding principles.

### Three Key Principles

#### **1. Unite in the Love Boldly and Miracle Sunday Initiative**

All congregations are encouraged to begin the Love Boldly Initiative immediately after Easter, culminating in Miracle Sunday during week six. If local calendars require, Miracle Sunday may be observed one week earlier. Participating together across the connection strengthens our unity and shared mission.

#### **2. Model Generosity**

Generosity grows when leaders lead the way. Drawing on the example of 1 Chronicles 29, we anticipate bishops, conference leaders, pastors, and lay leaders will give first—setting the tone and inspiring their congregations to follow.

#### **3. Educate on the Vision and the Need for Theological Education**

Help your congregation grasp the vision of The United Methodist Church and the urgent need to support theological training worldwide. Use the worship and small-group series, printed resources, and videos to teach, inspire, and engage your community in this transformative work.

Across continents and cultures, we are each doing our part to deepen faith, strengthen generosity, and prepare leaders for the future of the church.

## **Purpose and Call**

United Methodist leaders are inviting 30,000 congregations and their pastors worldwide into a God-led, Holy Spirit-empowered six-week emphasis: **Love Boldly, Serve Joyfully, and Lead Courageously**. Through worship, small-group resources, and shared learning, congregations will extend the vision of the church and receive a special offering to support **500 students annually** preparing for pastoral ministry across Africa, Europe, and the Philippines.

## **The Challenge**

Our church has weathered a global pandemic, navigated disaffiliation, and responded with compassion amid conflict, war, and disaster. Now we are called to embrace a renewed vision and invest in preparing 500 new pastoral leaders each year.

A significant leadership gap persists. In the United States, 71% of clergy hold a master’s degree in theology. Outside the U.S., fewer than 5% do. U.S. seminaries benefit from stronger denominational funding and substantial endowments, while more than 20 theological schools in Africa, Europe, and the Philippines operate with limited support and little or no endowment.

We can and must do better. By strengthening **The Endowment for Theological Education in Africa, Europe and the Philippines**, we will equip 500 additional graduates each year to Love Boldly, Serve Joyfully, and Lead Courageously.

## **The Endowment for Theological Education in Africa, Europe, and the Philippines**

An endowment is like planting a tree: its roots grow deep, its branches spread wide, and future generations benefit from its shade and fruit. This endowment not only supports students today, but it also ensures that pastors will be prepared for generations to come.

In 2014, the Council of Bishops recognized the urgent need to strengthen theological education beyond the United States and launched this endowment to address disparities across the connection.

The Endowment for Theological Education outside the United States is a permanently invested fund. The principal remains untouched, while investment returns provide ongoing support for theological education for generations of students.

### Why Endowments Matter

- **Sustainable:** Provides long-term funding that continues beyond any single campaign.
- **Reliable:** Offers consistent support year after year.
- **Impactful:** Creates a lasting legacy for all who participate in the Miracle Sunday offering.

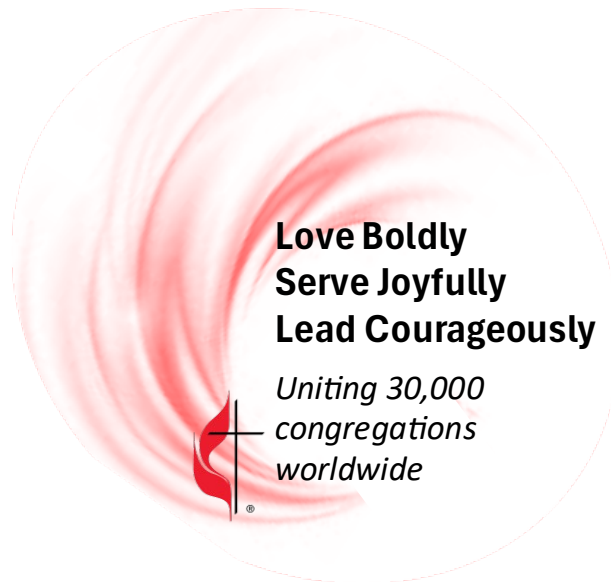

# Congregation Coordinator Role in Virginia

*Love Boldly, Serve Joyfully, and Lead Courageously*

## Congregation Coordinator Role

As a Congregation Coordinator, you hold one of the most vital roles in the Miracle Initiative. Through your leadership, God will inspire your congregation to participate in something truly transformative. This is far more than a fundraising effort; it is a spiritual movement.

## What the Miracle Initiative Is About

### 1. Worldwide Unity in Faith and Mission

United Methodists across the globe will join together in worship, prayer, and action. Across languages, cultures, and time zones, we will reflect on the same scriptures, pray similar prayers, and work toward a shared purpose—raising up courageous leaders for the future of the church.

### 2. A Shared Vision for Leadership

Together, we will support the development of leaders who love boldly, serve joyfully, and lead courageously in their communities and beyond.

### 3. Addressing a Global Challenge

A significant gap exists in theological education. While 71% of U.S. clergy hold a master's degree in theology, fewer than 5% of clergy outside the U.S. have similar preparation. The Miracle Initiative will help close this gap by strengthening theological education worldwide.

## Your Role as Coordinator

You are the difference-maker. Your leadership includes:

### 1. Pray Faithfully

Lift up your congregation and United Methodist churches around the world. Your prayers strengthen ministries of witness, mercy, and justice.

### 2. Facilitate and Communicate

Partner with your pastor to guide the initiative. You will receive videos, print resources, scripts, and other tools to help you organize, communicate, and inspire.

### 3. Organize and Enlist Support

Build a small team to help lead the initiative:

- **Small Group Leadership:** Recruit and support small-group leaders.
- **Communications:** Manage social media, newsletters, bulletins, and email outreach.
- **Leadership Commitments:** Host a gathering to encourage and collect leadership commitments to be shared with the congregation on **October 11, 2026**.
- **Visibility:** Create a display table or bulletin board to keep the initiative in front of your congregation.

### 4. Lead Faithfully

Follow the initiative manual, modeled after 1 Chronicles 29, where David led the people in generosity and shared purpose. These resources will guide your congregation toward a meaningful and spiritually rich experience.

## Coordinator Meeting with Pastor and Church Leaders

*Equipping Leaders and Congregations to  
Love Boldly, Serve Joyfully, and Lead Courageously*

### Meeting held by July 24:

The coordinator's meeting with the pastor and key church leaders is a vital first step in launching a God-led, Holy Spirit-inspired Miracle initiative. This meeting sets the foundation for:

- **Embracing and sharing the renewed vision of The United Methodist Church**—to be a church that forms disciples of Jesus Christ who, empowered by the Holy Spirit to love boldly, serve joyfully, and lead courageously in the community and the world.
- **Deepening faith and fostering spiritual growth** within the congregation.
- **Exploring the urgent need to develop clergy outside the United States**, equipping them to lead congregations in some of the most challenging mission fields.
- **Supporting theological education** in Africa, Europe, and the Philippines, ensuring a strong and faithful future for the global church.

While the coordinator may be able to carry out the entire plan for the initiative, as needed, the coordinator **may form** a team depending on the size of the congregation with each individual overseeing an aspect of the initiative. For instance, a team **may** include:

- Publicity and announcements coordinator – makes announcements during worship, provides written announcements for printing in newsletters, bulletins, message boards, and social media.
- Small group coordinator – works with existing small group leaders, Bible study leaders and Sunday school teaches to incorporate the small group Bible studies into the six weeks following easter and/or recruit and start short term small groups to involve more people.
- Worship and liturgy coordinator – works with the pastor to incorporate prayers, announcements and videos/written testimonies into the six worship services following Easter.
- Giving coordinator – prepares the materials and coordinates the giving on **Miracle Sunday, October 11, 2026**, and follow up reporting.

Congregation Coordinator meets with the pastor and church leaders to:

- Introduce the Miracle Sunday initiative – *love boldly, serve joyfully, and lead courageously*.
- Review the congregation manual and timeline.
- Discuss how to use initiative materials effectively.
- Encourage prayer support from the pastor, staff, and leadership.
- Provide access to the manual (printed or online at [www.endowftecc.org](http://www.endowftecc.org)).
- Prepare by reading the manual.

### Suggested Talking Points for the Meeting:

- We are joining over 30,000 congregations worldwide to raise up clergy leaders in challenging mission areas.
- Our bishops have endorsed a one-time worldwide offering to support theological education outside the U.S.
- There is a significant disparity in theological education funding:
  - U.S.: Denomination budgets \$54 million annually, 71% of clergy have master's degrees.
  - Outside U.S.: Denomination budgets \$5 million annually, less than 5% of clergy have master's degrees.

- The offering will help further a permanent endowment to perpetually form hundreds of clergy annually serving in the most challenging mission contexts outside the United States.
- The initiative includes a six-week worship and small group discovery series.

- This is an initiative of faith, guided by:
  - 1 Chronicles 29 – Biblical model of generosity David used to build the Temple.
  - Luke 21:1–4 – Equal sacrifice, not equal gifts. The story of the widow’s mite.
  - Luke 18:27 – God makes the impossible possible.
  - Matthew 19:26 - All things are possible with God’s help.
  - Ephesians 3:20 – Faith beyond expectations.
- We are asked to do our best, no gift is too small or too large. Equal sacrifice, not equal gifts.
- The initiative will bless our congregation and help us grow in faith.
- Offer to form an initiative team and pray and work together.
- Conclude by thanking the pastor and offering ongoing support.

### **Preparing for Small Groups (By August 30, 2026)**

Congregations do **not** need to start new small groups. Existing Bible studies, Sunday school classes, and ministry groups may journey through this series together.

If launching a new six-week season of small groups, or supplementing existing groups, use the framework below to invite participation and build momentum.

### **Recruiting Small Group Leaders**

Small groups may meet in:

- Homes
- Church spaces
- Online (Zoom, WhatsApp, or similar platforms)
- Restaurants or community spaces

### **Qualities of a Small Group Leader**

Leaders need not possess every quality but lead from a Christ-centered heart:

- Relational and approachable
- Empathetic and encouraging
- Motivates and celebrates others.
- Committed to personal and shared spiritual growth.
- Supports the church’s vision and mission.
- Listens well and facilitates healthy discussion.
- Creates a safe, welcoming space.
- Following through with responsibilities

## **A Prayerful, Relational Approach to Recruitment**

1. **Pray and Discern**  
Ask God to reveal those called to lead and nurture faith.
2. **Identify Potential Leaders**  
Look for individuals who embody the values listed above.
3. **Extend Personal Invitations**

4. **Provide Clarity and Support**  
Explain expectations and assure leaders that resources and guidance are provided.

I am not ashamed of the gospel of Jesus Christ, for it is the power of God unto salvation. And this quote is based on Romans chapter 1. My name is Reverend Princess Knuckles Jaller. I serve currently as the Director of the Department of Evangelism and Missions of the Liberia Annual Conference, the United Methodist Church.

I am where I am today because I was a beneficiary of theological education. Somebody sponsored me to be where I am today. I remember way down the line when I needed to go to seminary because I felt the call of God upon my life at a young age, but I didn't have the means to go to college to acquire a theological degree.

And through the process of time, God connected my church with a local church in the United States through one, Reverend Richard Oliver, and through his instrumentality in his church as well, I was able to get a scholarship to go and get my first degree in theology. And right after that, I also was opportune through the instrumentality of Bishop John G. Ennis to acquire my master's degree in theology. And I didn't just stop there.

Having realized that it was as a result of the goodwill of others that I was able to acquire a theological education, I also helped to reach out to empower many other young people in our conference to help get an educational idol by just helping them to pay their registration fee, helping to connect them to scholarships, and so forth. So theological education is very much important. But what makes it much more important and effective is that there is need for somebody out there to be able to give.

So I want to use this medium to encourage all of you who are watching that God touches your heart so that you'll be able to give the theological education. There are many of our brothers and sisters in Africa, many young people who have the passion for ministry, who would like to serve God in ministry, yet they don't have the means of acquiring a theological degree. And so whatever little you give is going to make a difference in empowering the life of a young man, a young woman, to get an education, to be able to serve in the local church, especially in times like these where the church is going through a storm, all right, and many of our pastors left because they said the United Methodist Church is no longer okay.

So please give and help to empower because we need more pastors. We need female clergy people like myself. We need young people who are out there who want to go into ministry but don't have the means.

When I started my ministry 20 years ago, I didn't think that I would end up here, because I started going from village to village with a horse and wagon. I didn't know anything about John Wesley. I had the desire to go and spread the gospel on the fields and stay with the people.

So, after a time, I came up in touch with the United Methodist Church, and we were thinking that we want to create a movement in Romania, and we want to journey with this Orthodox, because we are in Romania where 90% of the people are Orthodox. I'm Radeş Kalugar, and I'm the first ordained elder in the history of Romania in the United Methodist Church. What a journey for me.

I have stories to tell my kids. And it was in 2011 when we joined the United Methodist Church. I planned the church in the second largest city in Romania with the desire to spread more this Wesleyanism all over Romania.

So, we are now in a place where we have different community centers, and all our desires and everything that what we do here is linked with serving the community and journeying with the Orthodox in their spiritual journey until their spiritual eyes are open. So in order to go further and spread more this news and plant more churches, we are in a place where we want to empower more people. I was empowered, and I empowered others sending to the seminaries, sending to be trained as pastors, but now we are in a place where we need to see more people training.

So, what the United Methodist Church did for me and offering me this experience in Tallinn, in Estonia, I would love to see that develop in Romania. We want to plant more churches in Romania, and we need desperately more pastors in training. So, your contribution is something so much needed in our desire to spread the good news in this country.

So, I know that we are the people of the United Methodist Church that give generously, and I encourage you also to be part of this movement all over the world.

Simon Peter Samkuwoma from the United Methodist University, Sierra Leone, Bishop Vena School of Theology. Theological institutions have played a vital role in nation-building, promoting peace and religious tolerance.

Despite the impact of our institutions, we still struggle with funding, infrastructure, and access to technology. Most of our institutions are not locally funded. They heavily depend on the support of external partners.

That's the reason why this campaign means a lot to me. During my time in the university, we struggled a lot as students who were living on campus, but we were supported by missionaries who were using their salaries to take care of us in the university. That was really a good thing for us because we learned a lot of things in university.

During our stay, we learned about in our wounded world where human dignity is often marginalized, we learned to see people from the lens of God. That despite of your race, despite of your color, despite of your ethnicity, we are all created in the image of God. Theological education is really, really, really useful for our generation today, and it is good that you support theological education.

This campaign means a lot to us because it helps to sustain the very institutions that form leaders of faith, leaders of character, and leaders of peace. Today, we have come to tell you that this ministry is purposeful because Jesus taught us to go to the bad ways and the high ways of life and reach out to the sinners and bring them on, that they will be transformed for his purpose and for his glory. My name is Caleb Doma.

In 2022, we didn't expect what will come, because we are in Romania, a few hours from the Ukraine country. So, when the war started, we were just having our community center ready, thinking that we will serve the people. And this is what we did.

Because in February, when the war started, more than 250 Ukrainians came in our community center to find a safe place. I still remember the time when Oksana, a woman from Mariupol, came with Diana, her daughter, fleeing from that place and coming to our community center, because some of their friends were already here with us. And they say, come here, because we find Christians, we find good people that take care of us.

I'm Radeş Colugăr, I'm the superintendent of the United Methodist Church, and our heart is so much to serve the community around us. That's why we built community centers in Romania, and having this in mind, what Wesley has in mind, you know, to be where the people are. So, this is one of the reasons that we want to be where the people are and serve the community.

So, in these places where we are, we build safe places where people can come and have support groups and journey with us, because we are also in an Orthodox environment where people know about God, but they need to journey with God. So, when I started the movement in 2011 in Romania, I didn't know that I would end up in a Wesleyan place. So, I went and I studied in the seminary, and that experience was great for me, because that experience added something to already what I did in a way that served the community.

So we continue to do this in the same way, and all this year, having the Ukrainian refugees around us give us so much to think about, that what God really wants to do through us in these people that sometimes they are desperate, and they don't have where to go. And thinking about Oksana and her daughter, and the experience that they have, because her husband being captain and being on the sea, he was desperate, thinking, where is how my wife and how my daughter it is. But now they are reunited, they have a home, they have a place, and they are so much appreciated the time when they will be with us, and they also in this time, they found God.

So, all these things help us and empower us to believe that God is at work in our connection globally, and that's why we believe that with your support, we can empower more people to do more things for the Lord, preparing them for ministry. God bless you.
