I listed some of the adjectives commonly used to describe faith (unwavering, lack of, growing etc.) and pointed out that the one kind of faith God does not ask us to have is *blind* faith. I also talked about the importance of personally knowing the One in whom we place our faith and how our actions reveal the depth of our faith. On the final day, Ergi Klllogjri from Albania shared how hope sustained his people through difficult times of great religious oppression and we were treated to a fun skit about love, hope and faith.
