There are any number of good quality, audio-video recording software packages available that are either free or inexpensive (<\$100). These include:

For Mac users:

- Garageband is a great tool for blending audio. It is more advanced though! (free)
- iMovie is a free app for Mac users that allows two voices and videos to be layered together. It is fairly user-friendly. (free)
- Filmora (under \$100)

Windows:

- VSDC Free Video Editor
- Lightworks (free)
- Filmora (Under \$100)
